COVID 19 – General Tips for small businesses as of 18th March 2020 – 9 am

- Check your insurance for business interruption and pandemics. Insurance companies came to an agreement with government yesterday to be more flexible if the closure is not mandatory
- ❖ Look at Stock management reduce stock ask supplier to take it back
- Look at items or work which can turn quickly into cash payments to keep liquidity
- Talk to banks about extending overdrafts or access loans
- Speak to the lease/rental companies about extending credit and payment holidays etc
- Talk to credit card companies
- Mortgage providers to support customers with options including a payment holiday of up to
 3 months
- ❖ Awaiting details of support for Landlords and Tenants
- ❖ Ask suppliers to extend their terms or offer longer term payment plans
- HMRC have added a new payment helpline specifically to deal with COVID 19 0800 0159559 to help with businesses struggling to pay their tax. It is all tax and is based on individual cases
- Consider doing accounts early to establish if any July payment on account for tax can be reduced or potentially a partial repayment of the January 2020 tax payment
- Set up remote working facilities Face time, Skype, Google hangout have said they are temporarily offering their service for free
- ❖ Use electronic means of transferring data Drop box, Google docs, Portals
- Consider applying for universal tax credits including for staff
- Statutory Sick pay relief for small business cover up to 2 weeks of the statutory sick pay who have been off work due to COVID 19. Don't need to get a sick note. Let employers know in writing
- Statutory sick pay entitlement from day one no waiting time. Rate of £94.25 per week
- If there is no entitlement to Statutory Sick Pay i.e. paid under £118 per week apply for universal credit
- Self employed may be entitled to Employment support allowance need to check your national insurance record and contact the Universal Credit Helpline 0800328 5644

Business Rates Relief/GRANTS

English Rules and waiting on Wales for confirmation suspect they will be similar

- 1) If you are entitled to small business rates relief and have a single premises where the rateable value is £12k or less then *AUTOMATIC* get 100% business rates relief for 2020/21
- 2) If entitled to the retail discount of up to 100% this has now been expanded to the leisure and hospitality industry <u>IT IS NOT AUTOMATIC</u> need to apply to local authority. (Guidance will come out 20th March).
- 3) Rules are that pubs and hospitality businesses with a rateable value of £51k or less will get 100% relief and those in the bracket of £51k to £100k will receive a £5000 reduction
- 4) The initial £3000 cash grant to those businesses eligible to small business rates relief has now increased to £10000 - AUTOMATIC no need to apply the local authority will contact you. Funds likely to come from early April

5) A £25,000 grant will be provided to retail, hospitality and leisure businesses operating from smaller premises with a rateable value between £15,000 and £51,000.

Business Interruption Loan Scheme - to launch in a matter of weeks to help business access bank lending and overdraft

Staffing

- ❖ Staff layoff check your staff contracts. Employees who are laid off are entitled to a statutory guarantee payment of up to £29 per day from their employer. Limit of 5 days in any period of 3 months
- Use holiday if the employer decides to close they have the right to ask staff to take holiday
 but they must give staff at least twice as many days notice as the period they want to
 close. I.e. to close for 5 days they must give 10 days' notice
- Breaking news New off payroll working regulations IR35 rules relating to contractors which were due to come in April 2020 have been delayed until April 2021
